## FENCE REGULATIONS 2015

The Borough of Bernardsville does not have a fence ordinance. Therefore, there is no minimum setback nor maximum height nor "good-side out" rule. However there are several items that must be complied with, as follows:

- Zoning Permit showing fence location and type.
- All pool fences require permit.
- Fences over 6' require a building permit (standard application with detail/description and proposed location on copy of survey).
- Fences cannot be placed in the street right-of-way which is usually (but not always) $50^{\prime}$ wide and is usually shown on your survey.
- Fences cannot be placed in/restrict access to a Borough Easement, nor private easement, but thisis anissue between private parties (notreviewed by the Borough).
- On comer lots, a $30^{\prime}$ deep (into lot, perpendicular to the street) x 100'long (parallel to street) sight easement is common, in which a fence cannotbe located. Refer to your survey \& deed.
- On comer lots, no fence, structure of planting over 30" in height above the curb or edge of road can be installed within 20 ' of the comer property line.
- Generally theonlyland disturbance isthe installation of the fenceposts/poles. If any regrading is proposed which will disturb slopes over $15 \%$, a grading analysis is required (see steep slope hand-out).
- Any tree removal is subject to the Tree Protection Ordinance. On lots of 3 acres or less, up to 3 trees with a diameter at breast height (DBH) of 4 " to 10 " can be removed without apermit. On lots over 3 acres, up to 5 trees with a DBH of 4 " to IO" can be removed without apermit. Proposed removal beyond saidquantities, or of any tree with aDBH of over IO" requires application to the Shade Tree Committee.
- $\quad$ State regulations may apply (flood plain; wetlands; buffers).
- Although there is no minimum setback, you should contemplate access for maintenance.
